T: The Mysterious Constant of Nature and Foundation of Mathematics

Pi (π) is a constant number of great significance in mathematics. Here are some interesting facts about pi and examples of pi in nature:

Examples of Pi in Nature:

Circumference and Area of Circles: The circumference of a circle is obtained by multiplying its diameter by pi, while its area is calculated by multiplying the square of the radius by pi. **Wave Patterns:** Wave movements in nature often exhibit the properties of pi in many instances such as the ratio between the length of a wave and its height in the ocean can be related to pi

Astronomy and Space: In astronomy, pi is used in mathematical modeling of the orbits of planets and the movements of celestial bodies.

Plant Structures: The leaves, flowers, or branches of plants form regular geometric shapes. For example, many plant leaves form spirals associated with mathematical concepts such as the Fibonacci sequence or the golden ratio.

Structure of DNA: The diameter of the DNA helix is determined as a function highly influenced by pi.

Competitions held as part of Pi Day activities garnered significant interest among math enthusiasts. The Pi (π) corner competition and the competition to memorize the most digits of pi provided students with an opportunity to showcase their mathematical skills and learn while having fun. Esila Sanıvar, a 6th-grade student at the school, dazzled the audience with a remarkable performance by memorizing the most digits of pi and clinching the top spot on the podium.
